- Supported by all Palestinian factions.. The detainees of the Islamic Jihad Movement continue their open hunger strike, and some of them escalated their strike by refraining from water; To confront the abusive occupation measures and the continuous attack against the detainees.
- 37,500 Palestinians have been arrested by the occupation, including (6,770) children, and (1075) women, since the beginning of the Al-Agsa Intifada in 2015, including 1,300 on charges of incitement through Facebook.
- Occupation courts issue 7,300 administrative detention decisions, including (53) women, one of whom is still in detention, and (87) children, two of whom are still in administrative detention, since the beginning of Al-Agsa Intifada in 2015.
- 7 detainees continue their open hunger strike in the Israeli occupation prisons.





- The official in Hamas on the issue of detainees, Zaher Jabareen: "We are ready to conclude a prisoner exchange deal on the terms of the resistance, and we will not leave the detainees inside the prisons, no matter the cost, and the occupation is not ready to pay the real price that the resistance demands and has eluded for 7 years."
- The detainees' body: the detainee Yaqoub Qadri faces solitary confinement with catastrophic living conditions in a cell resembling a filthy grave.
- Detainee Zakaria Al-Zubaidi, one of the freedom fighters of Operation Freedom Tunnel, suspends his open hunger strike so that his lawyer can submit a petition to the Occupation Court against the procedures for his isolation and detention in difficult conditions.
- After the occupation's decision to suspend his administrative detention... Detainee Kayed al-Fosfus: I will continue my hunger strike until I gain freedom, despite the occupation police leaving my room in the Israeli "Barzilai" hospital.
- After a 53-day hunger strike... the detainee, Rayek Bisharat, won an agreement to end his strike, end his administrative detention, and release him on January 20, 2022.
- The Occupation Prisons Administration transferred the detainee, Sheikh Raed Salah, from isolating Ramon Prison to isolating Ashkelon.
- The family of the striking detainee Miqdad Al-Qawasmi: "Our son began to lose part of his memory, but he insisted on continuing the hunger strike until his release, despite the deterioration of his health."



- United Nations Human Rights: We express our deep concern about the conditions of 6 Palestinian detainees who are on hunger strike as a peaceful protest against administrative detention, and stress that Israel's widespread use of administrative detention does not respect international law.
- 6 years and the wound is still bleeding.. The detainee Esraa Al-Jaabis (37 years), from the town of Jabal Al-Mukabber in occupied Jerusalem, who is sentenced to 11 years in prison, begins her seventh consecutive year in the occupation prisons without taking into account her humanitarian situation.
- After he went on a hunger strike, the occupation released the detainee Guevara Al-Namura, in implementation of a decision that took him not to renew his administrative detention.
- Al-dhameer's lawyer: 19 detainees are isolated in very harsh conditions in the Negev prison. One of the detainees stated: "We live in caves and have been exposed to daily and continuous crime for a month, We are living in torment."
- As an initial protest step... the detainees of "Ashkelon" prison decide to close the section in protest against the administration's continued delay in transferring the detainee Nasser Abu Hamid to the hospital.
- The two detainees on hunger strike, Mahmoud Al-Amoudi from Jenin and Hosni Issa from Rafah, step up their strike and refrain from drinking water for the second day.
- The Prison Administration transferred the detainee Abd al-Ghani Herzallah from the Negev prison to the Petah Tikva interrogation

center, knowing that he has been in detention for nearly a year and is currently in administrative detention.

 The Israeli Ramon prison administration is still delaying the release of the detainees, Muhammad Al-Amoudi and Hosni Issa, who have been on hunger strike for three days, and have not provided them with any medical examination. They are currently in a very difficult health condition, and their determination is very high, and they continue to strike to end the penalties and measures taken by the Prison Authority against Islamic Jihad detainees in the occupation prisons.
