- Nael Al-Barghouti, the longest prisoner in the occupation prisons, begins his 42nd year in captivity.
- The detainee, Kayed Al-Fosfous, wins the battle of an empty stomach after 131 days of hunger strike.
- Detainee Ayyad Al-Harimy suspended his 62-day hunger strike after reaching an agreement to limit his administrative detention.
- Lawyer Jawad Boulos: The occupation prisons administration refuses to bring hunger-striking detainee Hisham Abu Hawash to court because of his difficult health condition.
- The family of the striking detainee Hisham Abu Hawash: "Hisham is in poor health, as he was unable to attend court or appear via video technology, and the occupation is procrastinating in stopping his administrative detention."

- The detainee, Fikri Mansour, from the village of "Jat Almothalath" in the occupied interior, begins an open hunger strike, in refusal to abuse him during his daily life in prison, and against the policy of constantly transferring him to solitary confinement without any warning.
- Detainee Nidal Mazen Ballout from Hebron announces his open hunger strike; To protest against his administrative detention in the occupation prisons.
- The detainee, Muhammad Al-Ardah, suffers from harsh conditions of detention in the isolation of Ashkelon prison, amid deliberate neglect of his difficult health conditions.
- The occupation sentences the Jerusalemite boy, Muhammad Khaled Abu Sneina, 17 years old, to 10 years in actual prison and 3 non-actual years, and a fine of 170,000 shekels.
- The detainee, Luay Al-Ashqar, who is on hunger strike, was transferred from the isolation of Al-Jalama Prison to Al-Ramla Prison Hospital, where he is suffering from a difficult health condition.
- The father of the hunger striker, Luay Al-Ashqar: "I don't want my son Luay to be martyred like his brother Muhammad, who was martyred in the Negev prison in 2007, and Luay is wounded and his health is deteriorating."
- "Walla" Hebrew website: The guard officer in Gilboa Prison fainted, and fell unconscious on the floor of the cell when he discovered the escape of the six detainees.
- On International Children's Day... the occupation has arrested 1,149 children since the beginning of the year, and two-thirds of the detainees have been subjected to physical torture.
- Quoting the brother of detainee Hudhayfa Badr: Detainee Badr suffers from a broken left foot after he fell in Ofer prison about a week ago, and the Prison Authority administration ignores providing him with treatment, and is satisfied with providing crutch instead of treatment.
- For the second time, an Israeli officer sends a bouquet of roses with a summons for investigation by the Israeli intelligence to the released detainee Mahdi Badawneh from Aida camp in Bethlehem on his wedding day.
- The detainee, Shatha Abu Fanona (60 years), from Ramallah, has been detained since her arrest 4 and a half months ago, despite her old age and suffering from several diseases, the most difficult of which are high blood sugar and problems with Irritable Bowel Syndrome. She is the Director General of the Health Work Committees.
- Jerusalemite detainee Amin Shweiki continues his strike for diabetes treatment for the 72nd consecutive day, in protest of his administrative detention.

- Detainee, Hussam Al-Qawasmi for the 25th day in a row.
- Detainee, Abdulaziz Marei for the 20th day in a row.
- Detainee, Fikri Mansour for the 7th day in a row.
