- Amidst a great reception in Umm al-Fahm, the occupation forces release Sheikh Raed Salah after 17 months of detention he spent in solitary confinement.
- "Between life and death"... The detainee Hisham Abu Hawash continues his hunger strike for the 125th consecutive day against his administrative detention in the Israeli occupation prisons.
- Severe tension has prevailed since yesterday in Israeli prisons against the backdrop of the systematic attack launched by the occupation prisons administration against the female detainees, and the detainees are continuing their protest steps in refusal to continue isolating the two detainees, Shorouk Dwaiyat and Marah Bakir, as well as the attack on the captive Esraa Ghatit by the "Nahshon" forces.



- Tension still exists in the prisons of the occupation against the background of the systematic attack launched by the prison administration on the detainees. The occupation continues to isolate the representative of the detainees, Marah Bakir, and the detainee, Shorouk Dwaiyat.
- The Israeli occupation court rejects the appeal of the case of the striker, Hisham Abu Hawash, and confirms his administrative detention order for 4 months, despite the seriousness of his health condition.
- Zaher Jabareen, head of the Hamas detainees' office, said: "We affirm that harming female detainees will have consequences. We are actively and continuously striving to prevent the occupation from attacking male and female detainees inside prisons."
- The leader of the Islamic Jihad Movement, Khader Adnan: "The occupation is committing a great foolishness by attacking the female detainees, and we call for anger in all arenas and squares."
- The Israeli "Ofar" prison administration imposed penalties on 12 detainees, including their isolation for 24 hours, a fine of 200 shekels for each of them, and deprivation of visitation and the "cantina" for a month.
- The occupation prisons administration transferred the detainee, Mahmoud Youssef Abu Taha, 46, from Khan Yunis in the southern Gaza Strip, from Ramon Prison to Barzilai Hospital, due to a sudden deterioration in his health. He has been detained since 2016 and sentenced to 5 and a half years in prison.

- Detainee Malek Hamed (27 years), from Silwad, Ramallah, is facing dangerous isolation conditions in the "Megiddo" prison cells, which have recently worsened his health, after he was repeatedly subjected to systematic attacks by the warders.
- The occupation extends the detention of the young Osama Salhab from Hebron, and he is still in Soroka Hospital after the brutal assault he was subjected to during his arrest a few days ago.
- Demands for international human rights and human rights institutions, particularly the Red Cross, to pressure the occupation to provide the detainees' winter requirements of clothes and blankets with the advent of winter, which the detainees greatly need due to the prisons' lack of them.
- The occupation returns dozens of families of detainees heading to visit their sons for the third time, claiming that they did not receive the third dose of the anti-Coronavirus vaccine.
- The Israeli Salem Military Court postponed the trial of the detainee Mona Qaadani from Jenin until 13/1/2022. She is a liberated detainee who was re-arrested last April.
- Head of the Palestinian Fertility Society Adwan Barghouti: We will not allow anyone to question the smuggled sperm process; Because it is carried out according to legal and scientific controls, and this is a sacred medical mission that helped our detainees liberate their children and challenge the occupation.
- The death of the released detainee, Issa Abdel Fattah Al-Hroub, as a result of being infected with the Corona virus.



- Jerusalemite detainee Amin Shweiki continues his strike for diabetes treatment for the 93rd consecutive day, in protest of his administrative detention.
