- The International Foundation for Solidarity with Detainees (Tadamon) participates in the activities of the 46th session of the Human Rights Council, and is organizing a symposium on the reality of Palestinian female detainees in the prisons of the occupation.
- After 33 days of the detainees' implementation of protest steps... the occupation prisons administration is retracting its procedures related to electronic gates and double inspection in "Nafha" prison, and the new agreement between the detainees and the occupation will remain subject to its implementation.

- The captive movement: "Our uprising continues, and the occupation prisons administration's reversal of its decision to reduce the hours we go out to the squares, is considered a step towards restoring our full rights, and it does not mean the cessation of our struggle to restore our full rights, and that all the factions are in a permanent meeting to prepare for a comprehensive strike soon according to the appropriate circumstances."
- Detainees Club: The detainees announce the 25th of March as the date for a hunger strike in order to achieve a number of the detainees' life demands, and to repel the systematic attack carried out by the prison administration against them.
- Administrative detainees in occupation prisons: "We announce the return of the medicine of sick detainees and we call on the free people of the world to stop the policy of administrative detention, and we call on our people to escalate in the face of the occupation."
- The Detainees Authority: "The oxygen tube still accompanies the detainee Nasser Abu Hamid, in addition to his loss of appetite and the inability to walk except in a wheelchair due to the difficulty of walking on his feet and shortness of breath."
- On International Women's Day... 32 Palestinian female detainees are being held by the Israeli occupation in its prisons, and they suffer from the most heinous violence

against women and the violation of their privacy.

- Palestine Center for Detainees Studies: 1,000 Palestinians have been arrested by the occupation, including (130) children and (22) women, during the past month, and the occupation courts have issued 185 administrative detention decisions since the beginning of this year.
- The detainee Khalil Al-Awawda from the town of Ithna, west of Hebron, continues his open hunger strike in refusal of his administrative detention.
- The detained leader, Husam Al-Razza, suspended his hunger strike after he extracted a decision not to extend his administrative detention.
- Under the slogan "Our decision is freedom"... the administrative detainees in the occupation prisons continue to boycott the occupation courts for the 73rd consecutive day to demand an end to the policy of administrative detention.
- The holder of the highest sentence in the world.. The detained leader, Abdullah Ghaleb Al-Barghouti (50 years old), a resident of Ramallah, has been sentenced to life imprisonment 67 times, starting his 20th consecutive year in the occupation prisons.
- The Israeli occupation transfers the detained patient Abdel Nasser Rabi to administrative detention for a period of six months after the Salem Court decision to release him.
- After visiting her son, Nour El-Din, who



is sentenced to life imprisonment, the occupation arrests the mother of the detainee, Nour El-Din Abu Hashiya, at the Taybeh checkpoint.

- For the third time in a row, the Israeli occupation renews the administrative detention of journalist Muhammad Nimer Asida from Tal Nablus district for a period of four months.
- On the day of his release, the Israeli occupation transferred the detainee Anas Shtayyeh from Nablus to administrative detention for four months after the end of

his actual four-month prison sentence.

- She left before embracing her son freely.. The death of the mother of the detainee, Alaa El-Din Tawfiq Barakat, from Jenin camp, knowing that he had been detained since 2002 and sentenced for life, and his father had died four years ago.
- Jerusalemite detainee Ameen Shweiki continues his strike for diabetes treatment for the 177th consecutive day in protest of his administrative detention.

The Israeli occupation prisons administration continues the solitary confinement, in difficult sanitary conditions, for each of the following detainees:
